## Windows Instructions

1. Type "Fonts" in the windows menu to open the Fonts program.
2. Click "Install Font".
3. Navigate to the folder where you unpacked this zip file.
4. Select the TTF file and click "Install".
5. Open MS Word-Pad or MS Word.
6. Select this font from the drop-down box.
7. Use bold, italic and character formatting to adjust the way it looks.

## Linux/Ubuntu Instructions

1. Type "Font" in the windows menu to open the Font Manager.
2. Click "Manage Fonts".
3. Navigate to the folder where you unpacked this zip file.
4. Select the TTF file and click "OK".
5. Open Notes or LibreOffice Writer.
6. Select this font from the drop-down box.
7. Use bold, italic and character formatting to adjust the way it looks.

## Mac Instructions

1. Go to the folder where you unpacked this zip file.
2. Double-click the TTF file to preview it.
3. Click "Install Font" at the bottom of the preview window.
4. Alternatively, you can put the TTF file into the Library/Fonts folder.
5. Open a word-processing or drawing program.
6. Select this font from the drop-down box.
7. Use bold, italic and character formatting to adjust the way it looks.
